An excellent Beni M'Guild example constructed of wool dyed from both natural and synthetic sources. The palette of pomegranate, indigo, taupe, celadon green, bright orange, coral red, and ivory has faded over time, lending character and a warm patina to the piece. A complex Berber message is spoken through an intricate lozenge network filled with traditional symbology. Side borders of H-motifs, arrows and triangles frame the composition. A few areas of fringe loss, consistent for a carpet of this age. 100% wool.
