This vintage Moroccan Boujad carpet features a more intricate approach to weavings from this tribe. The overall symmetrical stepped lozenge network is filled with and surrounded by numerous Berber symbols, including eight-pointed stars, triangles, arrow forms, flowers, hamsa, zig-zag, and X motifs. Branch borders, resembling flowering vines, frame the composition. The carpet is woven in faded salmon, apricot, brick red, lavender, celadon green, pink, charcoal, and ivory. 100% wool with a densely knotted low pile.
